Description of content

The event will be focused on the wooden horse used in the Troy War and will focus on the importance of critical, tactical and multiways thinking (Six-Hat Thinking Techniques/ De Bono).

Learning outcomes and competencies

*The learning output of this event: Wars that have an important place in history and changed the course of history were not just physical forces. Intelligence has been very influential in ways of thinking, culture and background of the people, beliefs and traditions. Competencies acquired, multi-dimensional thinking skills (which led to the beginning of events that will be turning points in history), and cultural backgrounds are the multicultural mindset that will help learners gain 21st-century skills in the globalizing world.*

*Learners; It focuses on understanding the backgrounds of the events that are effective turning points in history and with the information obtained, while overcoming an event, it is not only considered one-sided and events can be more successful with multidimensional thinking methods (6 hat thinking techniques).*

**De Bono's six hats:**

**White hat (Blank page): Neutral hat. Clear information and reports on the subject discussed are presented. (objective)**

**Red hat (Fire): It is the emotional hat. It gives people the opportunity to express their intuitions, ideas and feelings about the subject discussed without any basis. (subjective)**

**Yellow hat (Sun): It is an optimistic hat. The advantages of that job are revealed. Praise and positive opinions are said.(objective)**

**Black hat (Judge's robe): It is a pessimistic hat. With the criticism, negative opinions, the risks of the subject discussed and the problems that will arise in the future arise. modus tollens (objective)**

	<p><i>Green hat (Plant): It is an innovative hat. Alternatives and new approaches related to the subject are explored. 'everything fits' (speculative)</i></p> <p><i>Blue hat (Sky): It is a cool hat. Thought is systematized. "Big Picture," "Manager hat," "Meta hat," "thinking," the whole process (review)</i></p>
<b>Materials and equipment</b>	Computer, blackboard/screen, videos from Youtube, six hats(coloured), flipcharts, coloured pens.
<b>Setting</b>	<i>Face to face with a teacher</i>
<b>Theoretical lessons</b>	<i>Troy war and six hat explanations</i>
<b>Duration</b>	<i>The activity will take place in 45 + 45 minutes.</i>
<b>Type of interaction and brief description of the activity</b>	<p>Six thinking hats technique is one of the techniques frequently used to improve the creative thinking ability of learners. In the technique introduced by Edward De Bono, it is aimed to teach individuals how to be creative and produce new ideas. The basis of the technique is to put forward ideas and develop creativity by wearing hats of six different colors symbolizing thoughts.</p> <p>Learners are divided into groups. 6 tables are prepared and each table has a hat in a different colour. A moderator is assigned to each table. Each group assumes the role represented by 6 hats for 10 minutes and works on it. Each group changes the Tables every 10 minutes. Then he goes to a different table and assumes the role of the hat of that table and works on it. When each group visits the table where the 6 hats are represented, finally a joint presentation is prepared and the idea including the problem solution is put into open discussion.</p>

Glossary	<i>Achaean, Odysseus, Homeros, Heroic Age, Western Anatolia, Classical and Hellenistic Troy</i>
Assessment method	<i>At the end of the lesson, students will fill-in the questionnaire prepared by the teacher about the implemented activities. They will also reflect on the comparison of different thinking techniques and will employ the method of critical thinking and critical reading. They will state what they liked or disliked and will suggest improvements for future activities on this topic.</i>
